Key Issues

It's difficult to ensure environment, health and safety (EHS) performance – or even compliance – in the manufacturing facilities of developing countries. Factories in Bangladesh, India and China are ripe for improvement in worker health and safety in addition to improvements in environmental health, energy efficiency and GHG reduction. However, the single largest barrier to EHS compliance – particularly in small- and medium-sized factories – is a lack of trained practitioners with the technical skills and management expertise to address EHS priorities.

Project Overview

- The rapid growth of manufacturing in developing countries has caused a significant gap in local EHS expertise. To fill this gap, ISC developed EHS⁺ Centers in China, Bangladesh, and India to train factory managers in the skills needed to ensure a safe and healthy workplace.
- By training workers at the factory level, EHS⁺ Centers continuously move industry standards from basic EHS compliance to more proactive and holistically sustainable practices. Customized intensive trainings focus on fire and worker safety measures, workplace hazards, and electrical safety, in addition to GHG reduction, energy consumption and water usage.
- After the initial launch of an EHS⁺ Center, local partner organizations run and manage the day-to-day operations. Through its EHS⁺ Network, ISC provides administrative and marketing assistance, partnership cultivation, and curriculum development support to the EHS⁺ Centers.

Expected Impact

- ISC's EHS⁺ Centers have trained over 10,000 factory managers – over 88% of whom have made positive changes in their EHS practices, including improvements in worker injury rates, and have established a routine and transparent system for reporting EHS problems.
- EHS managers trained through the EHS⁺ Centers represent over 1,500 suppliers and more than 150 brands from a large range of industries including apparel and textile, electronics, food & beverage, paper, chemical, transportation, cosmetics, cleaning products, pharmaceutical, mechanical, metalwork, plastic & rubber, furniture, ceramics, and packaging.
- EHS⁺ Centers in China, Bangladesh and India are the foundation of ISC's global EHS⁺ Network, improving the sustainability of supply chains throughout Asia.
