

ARACÊ – Human Rights in Review

General rules for submission of original papers

1. Any papers for publication in the ARACÊ Journal shall not be published elsewhere in Brazil and shall not be pending approval by any other periodical.
2. The publication of papers is conditional upon approval by the Committee and the journal's Editorial Board, as well as reviewers. The criteria taken into account are originality in addressing the theme, consistency and rigor of the paper's approach, and its contribution to human rights and the journal's thematic line. The reviewers' name will remain confidential, and the authors' names will not be disclosed to the reviewers.
3. Papers are accepted in Portuguese, Spanish, English and French.
4. Papers shall be submitted online using the link <http://arace.emnuvens.com.br/arace/about/submissions#onlineSubmissions>. Alternatively, they can also be sent by email to arace@editoracla.com.br. They shall be submitted via text processing software compatible with the Windows environment.
5. Papers shall consist of 20,000 to 45,000 characters, including spaces, footnotes and bibliographic references.
6. The front page of each paper shall contain the following information: paper title, name(s) of author(s) and his/her/their contact information (address, telephone number, email), together with a brief résumé including key academic titles and the related institution(s).
7. Papers should contain an abstract consisting of up to 800 characters with spaces. Up to four keywords (descriptors) must be listed at the end of the abstracts. A translation of the paper title and abstract into English must also be provided. For

papers submitted in English, the title and abstract must be also provided in one of the three other languages accepted by the journal (Portuguese, Spanish or French).

8. Any tables, graphs, charts and figures must be placed in the original file together with the text section where the publication thereof is desired. Any JPEG or PDF figure and graph files must be provided in high resolution.
9. Any short citations must be integrated into the text between quotes, followed by the author's last name and year of publication between parentheses. Any quotes extending for three or more line must be highlighted in the text with indentation and a smaller font, with an indication of the author, year and page.
10. Footnotes are to be used parsimoniously, preferably not exceeding three lines.
11. Any acronyms should be explained the first time they are referred to in the paper.
12. Bibliographic references must be at the end of the text, in accordance with ABNT standards (NBR6023, 2002).
13. No copyright or any other consideration shall be payable for the publication of papers in the ARACÊ journal. Submission of the original paper for consideration operates as consent by its author(s) for publication by the journal.
14. The originals of any contributions sent by mail will not be returned by the journal.
