

EDF EN Mexico, a subsidiary of EDF Energies Nouvelles, operates several wind farms in the country in compliance with the regulation and with social and environmental best practices, and is committed to undertake open dialogue with the local communities. On February 21st, 2017 a group of landowners blocked the access to one of EDF EN Mexico wind farms, Eoliatec del Pacífico (“EDP”), located in the Santo Domingo community and requested the payment of fees to stop the blockage. Before the installation of EDP Wind Farm, usual and fair local consultations took place. Lease agreements between the landowners and EDF EN Mexico established contractual commitments which have always been respected by the company. EDF EN Mexico, supported by the landowners committee, kept dialogue with the group of landowners and made all possible efforts to reach into a solution with them. Following the blockage of EDP wind farm, State Police of Oaxaca decided to arrest 11 landowners to ensure public order, without the intervention of EDF EN Mexico. Not supported by the local community, the group of landowners finally stopped the blockage.
