ALCATEL ONETOUCH takes its ethical code seriously and adheres to strict guidelines with all its suppliers. The company conducted a third party professional audit on notification of these allegations in July 2014.

At that time, the supplier was made aware that if any breach of guidelines were discovered the contract would be terminated.

ALCATEL ONETOUCH is currently requesting further validation of that audit, as it found no current evidence of the allegations. However, we will continue with routine audits and to closely monitor our suppliers."
